Professional guidance counselors are available at the school district you choose for your children to attend and at local colleges by appointment. There are a number of private, private/public and charter schools to choose from.



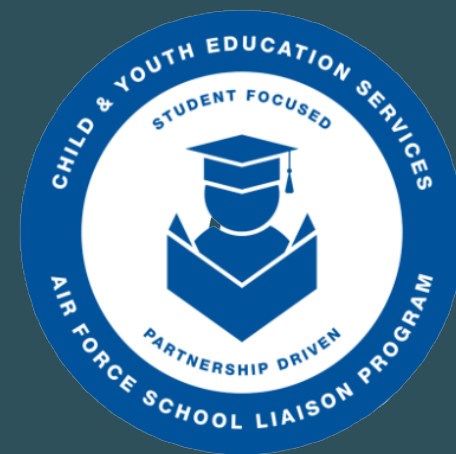
