### WHAT IS IMPACT AID & WHY SHOULD I CARE



Impact Aid is a federal program administered through the Department of Education. It provides funding for a portion of the cost for educating children whose families live on military installations and those parents employed on federal property.

There are over 3,000 military-connected students in our local schools. Whether you live on or off base, your affiliation to the military means potential federal funding for your child's school.

Why? Military installations are federal property and hence exempt from paying local property taxes. This loss of tax revenue results in reduced financial resources for the district. The Federal Impact Aid Program was set up to allow districts to receive reimbursement for the education of children who reside on military installations or have a parent who works on military/federal property.



When your child's school sends home the Impact Aid Survey Form, it is critically important that the surveys are signed, dated, and returned in the timeframe requested by the school.

## DEPLOYMENT SUPPORT


Your military-connected dependents may be absent from school up to five days to spend time with you in relation to your deployment--60 days before or up to 30 days after you return from deployment. "Military Interstate Compact (MIC3) SEC. 5.105-Absence as Related to Deployment Activities (a) A student whose parent or legal guardian is an active duty member of the uniformed services, as defined by the Compact, and has been called to duty for, is on leave from, or immediately returned from deployment to a combat zone or combat support posting, shall be granted additional excused absences at the discretion of the LEA superintendent or head of school to visit with his or her parent or legal guardian relative to such leave or deployment of the parent or guardian."

#### \$1500 GRANT

Supplemental Special Education Services (SSES) gives a \$1,500 one-time online grant to parents of eligible students served by special education who are enrolled in a Texas public school. Families can use this money to purchase educational goods and services for their student--therapy, books, laptop, tutoring, and/or tablet.

#### To be eligible for the SSES grant, students must currently be:

- enrolled in a Texas public school,
- enrolled in PreK 12th grade,
- and a student with a disability served through Special Education.

#### YOUTH SPONSORSHIP

If you are PCSing this school year, make sure you contact the Dyess AFB Youth Center or School Liaison to sign up for the Youth Sponsorship Program before you go. This will put your child in contact with a military-connected student at your new base with whom they can ask questions.
