# **Guest Responsibilities**

All problems should be reported to the front desk immediately by dialing "0" from your room telephone.

Before leaving your room, ensure all articles of clothing are stored in the closet and drawer space. Housekeepers are not authorized to handle personal items. If items are left on beds, the housekeepers cannot make the bed.

Go gentle on the furniture. Please leave furnishings where they are currently located. Guests will be responsible for any damages caused by movement or misuse.

Please do not use the linen to clean your shoes. Place your footwear on newspaper to avoid damage to the carpet.

Rooms are usually cleaned between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 2:30.p.m. For shift workers: call 696-1892/1871 to arrange a convenient time for housekeeping to clean.

Be courteous to other occupants. Base quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m.-7:30 a.m. Please respect these hours.

All room charges are paid at check in for 15 days in advance and every 15 days thereafter.

Requests for extensions beyond 30 days must be in letter form, addressed to the Dyess Inn Lodging Office, and will be handled as a new reservation and on a space available basis. 24 hour notice required for all extension request. Availability cannot be guaranteed but every effort will be made to accommodate requests.

Check out time for all guests is **11 a.m**. Late checkout charges will be applied for an extra night. If you have special circumstances, please contact the front desk the day prior to check out.

Service members are responsible for the actions of their dependents and visitors. Base policy states that children under age 10 must be in full sight of parents at all times.

You are responsible for cleaning the kitchenette area, refrigerator, stove and dishes during your stay. A fee will be charged for guests who check out leaving these items dirty.

Personal property should be locked in your luggage, safe or taken with you when you leave the room. Housekeepers are instructed not to pick up or move occupants' personal property at any time. Leaving items lying around the room results in your quarters not being properly cleaned.

Money or high value items left lying around your room will be reported to management. Guests who report the loss of secured personal property may file a claim against the government through the base legal office at 696-2232. We are not responsible for lost or stolen articles.

All rooms have safes available for your use at no charge; we highly encourage you to store your valuables in these during your stay.

# **Housekeeping Responsibilities**

Our housekeeping staff provides the following guest services to make your stay as comfortable as possible. However, the staff cannot vacuum the floor or make the bed if there are personal items left in either of these areas.

The following daily services are provided to guests that are staying for more than one night: Make the bed

Clean the bathroom: change out towels, bath mats, and washcloths that are placed on the floor in the bathroom. If you wish to reuse your towels and washcloths, please leave them hanging on the towel bar. To reuse your bathmat, hang it over the side of the tub. Empty the trash containers

Replenish toiletry type amenities when 1/3 of the product remains. You may request these items from the front desk or housekeeping staff. Dust and vacuum the room as necessary

For guests staying longer than 1 week, linens are changed every five days. If you wish to schedule a specific day for your full service, please contact our front desk staff at 696-1876 or our housekeeping lead staff at 696-1892.

Due to security and facility maintenance, the "Do Not Disturb" sign may not be displayed for longer than 2 days. On the third consecutive day the sign is displayed, management or housekeeping will enter your room unless prior arrangements have been made. For guests displaying the sign early in the morning, please remove it by noon to receive service for that day.

Our housekeeping staff must enter Pet Friendly rooms on a daily basis. Please refer to our guest pet policy, signed on arrival for more information regarding this policy, or contact our front desk staff.

The housekeeping staff will provide the following services to rooms that have been checked out of:

Change linens, make bed Clean the bathroom Change out towels, bath mats, and washcloths Empty the trash containers Replenish amenities Dust and vacuum the room

### Linen/Towels

For additional blankets, towels, or sheets, contact housekeeping at 696-1892 during duty hours, or the front desk ("0") after duty hours. Towels are changed daily unless these items are hung on your towel bars and linens changed weekly. Please do not damage or remove these items from your room.



# **Safety Policies and Procedures**

#### PETS ARE ONLY PERMITTED IN PET FRIENDLY TLF QUARTERS OR IN THE ANIMAL WALKING AREA NEAR BUILDING 7425/7426. ANIMALS MUST BE ON A LEASH. Only cats and dogs are allowed and a maximum of 2 pets are permitted per room. Please see the front desk for more information. A \$150.00 cleaning fee will be charged for violating the pet policy and you will be required to checkout.

Pets may also be housed in local off base animal boarding facilities. Please refer to the index for the area kennels listing.

Smoking **IS NOT** permitted in any of our facilities to include indoor common areas. A **\$150.00** cleaning fee will be charged for violating the *NO SMOKING* policy and you will be required to checkout.

UL approved coffee pots are provided for use. Use ONLY cooking or heating devices provided. Candles are not to be burned in any facility. Cooking equipment, with the exception of the coffee pot and microwave provided, is not permitted in our VQ or DV Suites and must be only utilized in the guest kitchen areas.

For rooms with cooking equipment or other electrical appliances, do not leave them unattended when in use.



# **Energy Conservation**

Before leaving your room check that televisions, radios, and lights are turned off.

Keep thermostat no higher than 72 degrees in winter (heat) and no lower than 74 degrees (air conditioning) in summer. Some rooms only have fan control switches.

Report maintenance problems to house keeping at 696-1892/1871 (8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) or the front desk (4:30 p.m. - 8:00 a.m.).



## **Anti-Terrorist Force Protection Condition**

- **Force Protection Condition Alpha -** Declared as a general warning of a possible terrorist activity, and when circumstances do not justify full implementation of a higher THREATCON. This may be declared when incidents occur which could lead to possible terrorist incidents worldwide.
- **Force Protection Condition Bravo** Declared when there is an increased and more predictable threat of terrorist activity, even though no particular target has been identified. This will be declared if information exists that terrorist elements are actively preparing for operation.
- **Force Protection Condition Charlie** Declared when an INCIDENT occurs or when intelligence is received that some form of terrorist action is imminent and DOD or US targeting is present.
- **Force Protection Condition Delta** Declared when a condition exists in the immediate area where a terrorist attack HAS OCCURRED or when intelligence is received that terrorist action against the Abilene area or Dyess Air Force Base resources is likely.



# **Fire Safety**

Please familiarize yourself with the location of the nearest fire exit. Floor plans are on the back of each door. In the event of a fire, please move quickly, but calmly, to the nearest exit. It is mandatory that all fire or smoke incidents be reported to the Fire Department at **911 or 696-2117** and the front desk.

Please help us by observing the following rules:

**Do not** touch or tamper with the smoke detectors. If your smoke detector is activating for no apparent reason, contact the front desk.

**Do not** hang clothing or other items on the sprinkler heads. This could activate or damage the system.

**Do not** tamper with fire extinguishers. Tampering or playing with fire extinguishers may result in injury and your removal from the facilities.

**Do not** store highly flammable liquids (gasoline, charcoal lighter, flammable paint, etc.) in your room.

**Do not** use unauthorized cooking or heating devices in your room.

Do not place charcoal grills within 15 feet of the building.

Do not leave cooking equipment unattended.

**Do not** place hot appliances such as irons, coffee pots etc., in closets, cabinets or drawers.

Do not overload electrical outlets.

Do not leave televisions, radios or other electrical appliances on.

**Do** follow good housekeeping practices.

**Report** low-pressure fire extinguishers to the front desk.



# **Guest Safety**

Your safety and the security of your personal property are of the utmost concern. We urge you to take advantage of the following suggestions:

If you need to leave money or valuables in your room, please use the safe provided.

Always lock your door, even if you are just leaving for a few minutes.

Do not allow persons in your room without first verifying identification. All rooms have a peep hole in the door. If there is any doubt about a person's identity, please contact the front desk.

Safeguard your key card. Be sure to leave it at the front desk upon checkout. At checkout, it is always safer to drop your key card at the front desk; however, you are welcome to leave it in your room. Please do not leave it in the door as someone could enter your room. Any missing or damaged items would be the responsibility of the registered guest. Do not give your key card to others.

If the lock does not work, contact the front desk for immediate repairs.

Secure all locking devices provided on windows and doors at all times.

Do not keep valuables inside parked vehicles.

Do not reveal your name or room number to strangers.

Do not discuss plans of being absent from your room in front of strangers.

Do not leave luggage unattended.

If you notice suspicious activity, please contact the front desk immediately.



# **Tornado Information**

Tornadoes are most prevalent April through September. However, they may strike at any time during the year.

Plan Ahead. Before the season arrives, find a shelter area in your home or work area. This should be a central hallway or closet on the ground floor. Instruct family members on actions to be taken in case of your absence. In the event of any disaster, it is a good idea to keep emergency supplies on hand. Emergency supplies should include:

Flashlight and extra batteries Portable, battery operated radio and extra batteries First aid kit and manual Canned food and bottled water Non-electric can opener Essential medicines Sturdy shoes Cash and credit cards

#### NOTIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR GUESTS BY BUILDING Do not open windows! Stay away from glass windows!

For buildings 7407, 6135, 7218: go to the ground floor center hallway.

For building 7425/7426: take shelter in the bathroom.

For buildings 7403: take shelter in the bathroom.



# Notification

Local radio and television stations will issue tornado watches or tornado warnings as notified by the National Weather Service. A 3 TO 5 MINUTE STEADY tone on the base siren may also announce tornado warnings.

TORNADO WATCH: Weather conditions are favorable for the formation of tornados. Tornado activity may be expected.

TORNADO WARNINGS: Tornado has actually been sighted or detected by radar.

### If Issued A Tornado Watch:

Restrict children to the immediate vicinity.

Secure any loose personal items stored outside of the facility.

Monitor the local radio and television stations for official weather information if thunderstorm activity is observed.

### If Issued A Tornado Warning:

**STAY INSIDE YOUR BUILDING!** Injury or death may occur if you are caught out in the open.

Monitor local radio and television stations. Confirmed sightings and movements will be broadcast.

If either the base siren or a loud roar is heard, or if you sight a tornado, take cover in the central hallway or bathroom.

#### AVOID AREAS NEAR WINDOWS. DO NOT REMAIN ON THE SECOND OR THIRD STORY OF ANY BUILDING. LIE FLAT ON THE FLOOR UNDER SOME PROTECTIVE COVER.







# In the beginning

World War II saw the blossoming of "tent camps" throughout the United States and Abilene was no exception. Camp Barkeley, a few miles south of Abilene, became an Army infantry training camp for thousands of recruits. Army inductees were trained for various duties while there.

Army Air Corps cadets learned to fly trainers and P-47 Thunderbolt fighters while stationed at Tye Army Air Field, a Camp Barkeley adjunct. When both installations were closed at the end of WW II, the deed to Tye Army Air Field was sold to Abilene for \$1. Fifteen hundred acres of the former Army Air Field were used by the Texas National Guard as a training facility.



Following the outbreak of the Korean crisis, Abilenians called for a military installation. Armed with 1,500 acres and determination, civic leaders besieged Washington, DC and Pentagon officials with their request for a military installation. Proving beyond a shadow of a doubt they meant business, Abilenians raised \$893,000 to purchase an additional 3,500 acres to provide a home for the military base they hoped would be in Abilene.



Several prominent men were instrumental in convincing authorities of the suitability of Abilene. Oliver Howard, the late W.P. Wright Sr. and others worked in the city to promote interest in the military facility. Together with Senator Lyndon B. Johnson and Congressman Omar Burleson, civil leaders persuaded military and civilian officials to put a military base in Abilene.

After letters and visits had been exchanged, the Department of Defense announced in July 1952 Congress had approved the \$32,273,000 needed in appropriations for constructing a base in Abilene.

The local community was interested in providing for the Air Force an exemplary relationship between the community and an Air Force base. After initial ground-breaking ceremonies on Sept. 24, 1953, construction of the base progressed rapidly.

The red brick ranch-style architecture boasts a Texas influence throughout the base. A unique feature of the base is all buildings are permanent structures.



Known as Abilene Air Force Base, the Strategic Air Command base was dedicated by the city fathers at the end of Abilene's Diamond Jubilee April 15, 1956. On Dec. 6 that same year, the base was renamed Dyess AFB in honor of Lt. Col. William Edwin Dyess.

On Feb. 8, 1961, Dyess Air Force Base became home to the Tactical Air Command's 64th Troop Carrier Wing (Medium) flying the C-130 Hercules Abilene and the entire Big Country community celebrated President Reagan's announcement on Dec. 21, 1983, that Dyess AFB would receive the Air Force's first operational B-1B's. The arrival ceremony June 29, 1985, for the Star of Abilene included more than 50,000 people,
